



GOD CHOOSES METHOD

Read Galatians 1:12. What is the significance of the word “revelation” (ESV) or the Greek word apocalypse? What does the word mean? How does this method differ from other ways of gaining knowledge or experience?

Read Ephesians 3:1-13. Why is the Gentiles being “fellow heirs” – (verses 5, 9) a mystery? How do these verses contrast with God’s past actions? What does this passage have to say about how God chooses to make known His gospel?

Read Deuteronomy 29:29. Why is it not possible for us to know all things? How is it possible for us to do the law, yet not rely on doing the law for our salvation? What is God’s method for understanding the law?

GOD CHOOSES JESUS

Read Galatians 1:12. Describe how Jesus is God's gospel method. How is Jesus different from the law method? How does believing in Jesus differ from our doing good things in order to please God?

Read John 14:9. What does it mean to see God? How does a person see God? Is there another way to see God? How do we know our answer is true?

Read 2 Timothy 2:8. What is so important about Jesus being the "offspring of David" (ESV)? Why is Jesus being risen a significant part of the gospel?

GOD CHOOSES US

Read Acts 9:1-19. How Paul was chosen by God? How likely a candidate was Paul to be chosen?

Read Revelation 1:1-3. What does verse one have to say about who hears the revelation? How did God reveal His message to John? How does one experience God's blessing?

Read Matthew 11:25-30. What qualifications do we need to have to understand the gospel? Who has the authority and the ability to make us understand God? What can we conclude if we understand the gospel? How is this conclusion beneficial to us? If a loved one or friend does not understand, what is the most effective thing we can do? Why?
